Historic Resources Element Task Force




The City Council has created a task force to consider an Historic Resources Element in *Plan Santa Barbara*.

This is of interest since so many of Santa Barbara's historic structures are in our neighborhood. Did you know that over 150 of the properties designated as candidates for historic resource status are in the Upper East? It's true.

The Historic Resources Element will consider issues such as the creation of new historic districts in the City, new design guidelines for historic properties and possible zoning incentives for historic property preservation.

UEA board members are monitoring the deliberations of this task force, and we'll keep our membership informed of developments in our email newsletters.



Traffic Safety Improvements at East Los Olivos & Anacapa



The Upper East Association has been working with the City for over a year to improve safety at the

accident-prone intersection of East Los Olivos and Anacapa Streets. In March 2011 several UEA board members facilitated a meeting of interested neighbors and then shared their recommendations with the City Public Works Department.

Public Works followed up, and there now are vivid chartreuse signs warning drivers on Los Olivos that cross traffic does not stop, large directional arrows have been painted on Anacapa to remind turning vehicles that it's a two-way street, and new speed warning signs have been posted on southbound Anacapa St. Neighbors have cut back shrubbery to improve drivers' ability to see vehicles traveling on Anacapa.

Neighbors collaborating to solve problems really does work. We're proud of the role that the UEA played in bringing the neighbors together to develop a solution for this dangerous intersection.

Next Garden Exchange – October 1st



We've held five successful garden exchanges this summer, with more

Keeping the Upper East Beautiful and Safe



Thanks to perseverance by several UEA board members, two

blights on our neighborhood have been mitigated recently. The weeds and trash have been removed from the vacant property at State and Mission Streets, and a homeless camp in Mission Park has been cleaned out.

Natural History Museum Master Plan & Safe Passage Project



The Museum of Natural History has initiated development of a Master Plan to guide the improve-

ment and modernization of its facilities. The plan has been revised from the original draft to reduce the size of the project and to address concerns raised during its conceptual review process. The revised Plan was reviewed by the Historic Landmarks Commission and Planning Commission in a joint session on July 20th.

The UEA continues its collaborative effort with the Museum, Mission Canyon Association and Riviera Association, along with adjacent institutions and property owners, to address the safety issues, especially for pedestrians, between Mission Park and Mission Canyon. To date, the *Safe Passage* project has convened a core group of over 20 people and has held 2 work sessions and a 'walkabout'. Numerous issues have been identified and a consensus is emerging on improvements to recommend.

The success of this effort depends on building solid support from the three neighborhood associations. The next work session of the core group is scheduled for early October. Following this work session, and assuming that the work of this core group continues to be positive and productive, a presentation from the *Safe Passage* core group to the three association boards will be scheduled.
